Farm Stroll is a self-guided tour of McHenry County's diversified family farms. There is no beginning or end of the tour: just choose the farms you wish to visit and go during the stroll's timeframe. Don't bring pets, please.

There is no charge for Farm Stroll. However, bring some cash; individual farmers will be selling products and produce.

Some farms will conduct tours and demonstrations. Follow the farmers' instructions, respect the animals, and watch your children. Wash your hands after exposure to livestock.
