



Bartman part of D.C. group

John Bartman, Marengo farmer member, joined a group of 13 farmers in Washington, D.C., in September. The group spent part of their time on Capitol Hill discussing tax reform, the new farm bill and the need for a strong crop insurance program. Farmers met with their member of Congress or their staff, U.S. Sen. Dick Durbin, D-Springfield, and the staff of Sen. Tammy Duckworth, D-Hoffman Estates. They also discussed the farm bill with staff from the House Agriculture Committee.

Leaders to Washington participants also met with Ray Starling, special assistant to the president for agriculture and agricultural trade, and Richard Chalkey, associate director of the National Economic Council. The meeting came about a week after President Donald Trump tweeted: "The United States is considering, in addition

to other options, stopping all trade with any country doing business with North Korea."

Illinois ranks third nationally in the export of agricultural commodities, with \$8.2 billion worth of goods shipped to other countries. Exports from Illinois account for 6 percent of all U.S. agricultural exports. Illinois is the nation's second leading exporter of both soybeans and feed grains and related products. About 44 percent of grain produced in Illinois is sold for export.

The farmer group also stressed the need for regulatory reform Wednesday with officials from the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency and USDA in Washington, D.C. They discussed wetland determinations, renewable fuels, census of agriculture, farm bill sign-up and annual county rental rates, along with the regulatory reform effort at USDA.

Membership offering expanded

McHenry County Farm Bureau is expanding its membership classifications to include a Professional Voting Membership (PM).

A person qualifying for a PM membership: works in an agriculture-related occupation and does not meet the requirements for a Regular (Farm) Voting Membership (\$2,500 or more gross farm income). PM members will receive FarmWeek and will be eligible to serve as directors of McHenry

County Farm Bureau as part of their benefit packages.

The new PM annual dues are \$50 a year, but for a limited time you can reclassify your existing associate membership for free. Dues for PM and Farm members renewals for 2018 will be \$50 and associate members will be \$20.
