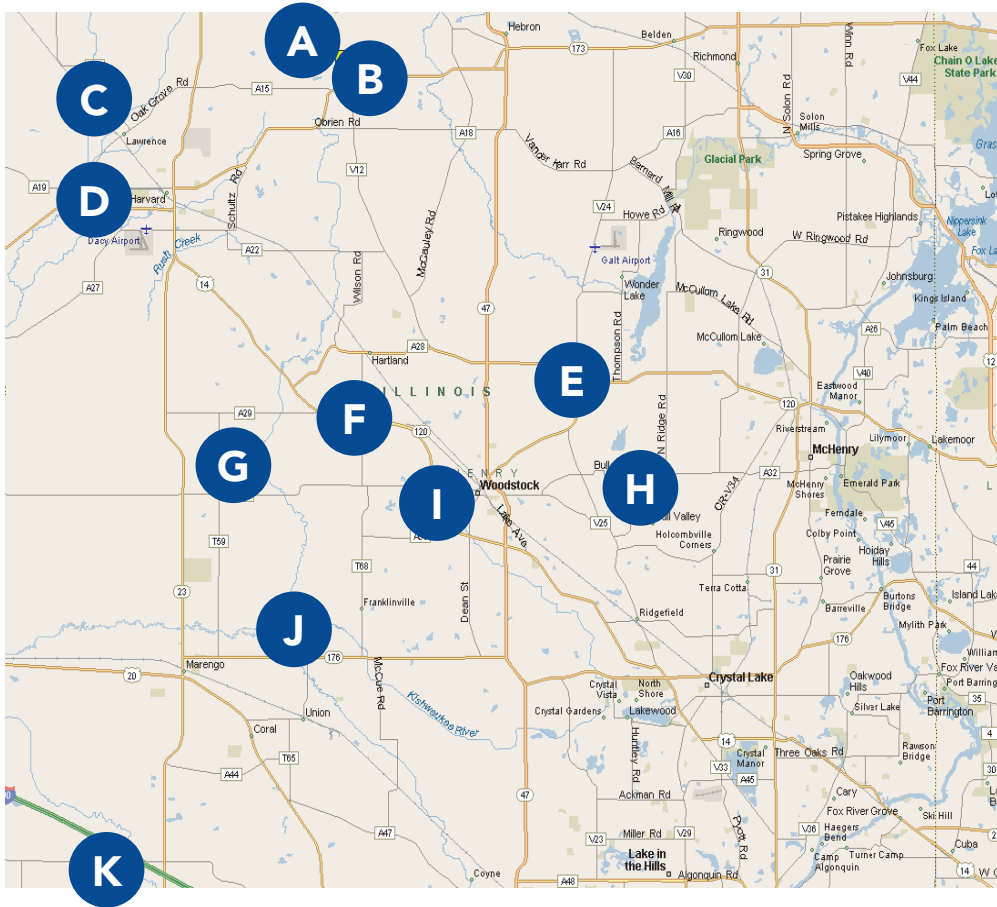

Wanda Farms | 17419 Hebron Rd., Harvard | A

This is a first-generation, no-till, regenerative farm run by Jessica Davies. The 63 acres are rooted in ecological stewardship, beauty, and nourishment. Over 40 varieties of vegetables and flowers are grown using WWOOF volunteers (learn more at the farm!). Adama focuses on soil health, biodiversity, and slow, intentional growing practices.
