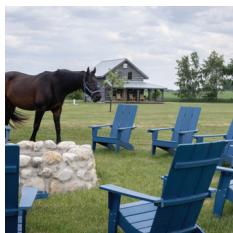
Hephzibah Farms, Inc. | 13202 Hebron Rd., Hebron | C
