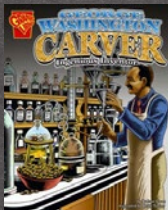

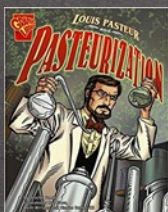

Grades 7-9



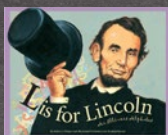

Grades 4-9



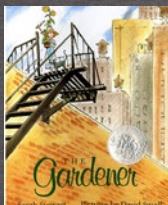
